

## Psychoanalytische Perspectieven – Notes for Contributors

The Department for Psychoanalysis of Ghent University publishes *Psychoanalytische Perspectieven* quarterly in Dutch, French, German and English at Ghent, Belgium. The blind peer reviewed journal publishes original contributions to the theory, practice and applications of psychoanalysis. Submission of a paper to Psychoanalytische Perspectieven will be taken to imply that (a) the paper is in accordance with professional ethics; (b) the paper and its main argument represent work not previously published and not being considered elsewhere for publication without authorization by the editor; (c) possible co-authors fully agree with publication; (d) copyrights for quotations are fully respected; (e) the publisher automatically acquires the copyright of the typescript.

1. Send your text as a word-document to:

2. Send scanned material (schema's, illustrations etc) as a separate document.

3. Make use of Times Roman (14); footnotes in Times Roman (12); sober use of italics is allowed.

4. *Psychoanalytische Perspectieven* is a blind peer reviewed journal: please add your name, first name, address, e-mail and phone on a separate sheet.

5. Use one type of heading, not numbered.

6. At the beginning of a new paragraph: put three spaces.

7. On a separate sheet: provide an abstract (min. 150 words), the title of your contribution and five key words in English; in case your contribution is in Dutch, French or German: add a second abstract in the language of your contribution.

8. References in the text:

- a. In case of a quote, as follows: (Freud, 1900a: 128-129)
- b. In other cases: (Freud, 1900a) or (Freud, 1900a: 128-129)

9. Complete references at the end of the text, as follows:

10. Each contributor confirms that her/his contribution is not submitted and will not be submitted to another journal (while in review); each author receives confirmation of receipt as well as two reviews; in case of acceptance the first author receives a proof.
